Dear Board of Directors,


My name is Sue Steinert and I am a parent volunteer with MAYA (Marshfield Area Youth Actors). We put on theatrical productions approximately once a year. When our group started in 2008, the mission was "Kids helping kids". A portion of our profits have gone to various organizations over the years.

During the past couple of years, we were searching for a new home since our dinner theater location no longer was an option. Chestnut Center for the Arts in Marshfield welcomed us with open arms. We decided to give them a portion of profits in exchange for using their facility. Since we no longer were a dinner theater, we provided complimentary refreshments during intermission. Prior to having dinner theater shows, we provided refreshments and containers for donations which we used to purchase additional refreshments for future shows.
