Do you ever wonder what becomes of the items left at the Vietnam Memorial?



From the day the memorial opened on November 13, 1982, visitors have been leaving mementos there to honor their fallen friends, family members and comrades in arms. Park Service personnel began collecting them because they didn't have the heart to throw them out. To date, more than 400,000 items have been left at The Wall, from a motorcycle to a

handwritten card. Park rangers collect the items daily and bring them to a secure storage facility where they are sorted and archived. A virtual collection of nearly 500 items left at the memorial is available at vvmf.org/items.
