

Dear friend of the Never Forgotten Honor Flight,

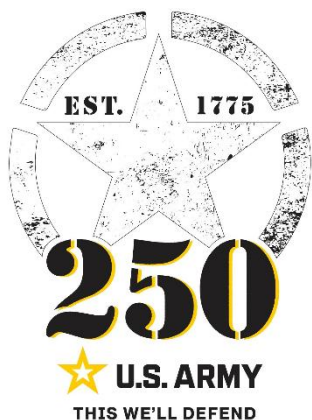
